Additionally, critical analyses and scholarly articles discussing her literary contributions and social impact were examined to provide context and insights into her role as a voice for Uzbek women.

Poems such as "Muqaddas Ayol" (Sacred Woman) and "To'marisning Aytgani" (The Sayings of Tomyris) showcase her commitment to empowering women and challenging traditional gender roles [2].

Xudoyberdiyeva's poetry also reflects her deep connection to Uzbek history and culture, as evidenced by her references to legendary figures like Tomyris, the ancient Massagetae queen who defeated Cyrus the Great [3]. By interweaving these historical elements with contemporary themes, she creates a powerful narrative that resonates with Uzbek women across generations.

ANALYSIS AND DISCUSSION

The analysis of Halima Xudoyberdiyeva's poetry reveals the depth and complexity of her themes, as well as her skillful use of literary devices to convey her messages. In her poem "The Whisper of Leaves in My Heart", Xudoyberdiyeva employs vivid imagery and metaphor to depict the inner struggles and resilience of the human spirit:

I created gardens within my own world. They withered away.

I created mountains from the power of thought. They crumbled. [6]

The metaphorical gardens and mountains represent the poet's aspirations and dreams, which, despite her efforts, seem to wither and crumble. However, Xudoyberdiyeva's resilience shines through as she refuses to give up, stating:

I burned, but I did not turn to ashes, repeatedly

I poured my forehead sweat and heart's blood onto the soil.

This powerful imagery conveys the idea of perseverance and the determination to keep striving despite setbacks and challenges.

In her poem "The Days of Abundance Have Come...", Xudoyberdiyeva addresses her mother, urging her to embrace the present and let go of past sorrows:

Return to the days of abundance, mother, closing your eyes,

If you don't want the Judgment Day to begin in your lonely heart. [7]

The poet's call for her mother to find solace in the present and appreciate the beauty of life, even in the face of past hardships, is a testament to Xudoyberdiyeva's belief in the power of resilience and hope.

Halima Xudoyberdiyeva's poetry serves as a testament to her dedication to giving voice to the experiences and aspirations of Uzbek women. Her works not only shed light on the challenges faced by women in Uzbek society but also inspire hope and empowerment. By addressing themes of feminism and women's rights, Xudoyberdiyeva played a crucial role in raising awareness about gender inequality and advocating for change.

The critical acclaim and recognition Xudoyberdiyeva received throughout her career, including being awarded the title of People's Poet of Uzbekistan and the Order of El-Yurt Hurmati (Respect of the Homeland) medal [4], underscore the significance of her contributions to Uzbek literature and society. Her poetry has been praised for its "perfect examples" of Central Asian female Sufi poetry [5], further cementing her status as a literary icon.
